He continued at the University of Bristol Medical School working as a postdoctoral research associate in the lab of Professor Geoff Turner, studying the molecular genetics of the fungus *Aspergillus nidulans*. He took up a Lectureship in Microbiology at the University of Bradford in 1990 and for 10 years was involved in molecular studies of various pathogens and the mode of action of antibiotics such as the cyclic peptides.

In 2000 he was appointed Deputy Head of Biological and Food Sciences at Lincoln and was the Head of the School of Natural and Applied Sciences 2005-2012.
